Community Discussion: Phrases and Microaggressions

- Briana led members and attendees in a discussion focused on phrases that can be seen as microaggressions.
- Microaggressions are defined as everyday verbal, nonverbal, snubs, insults, whether intentional
 or unintentional which communicate hostile, derogatory, or negative messages to target
 persons based solely upon their marginalized group membership.
- While microaggressions are generally discussed from perspective of race and racism, any
 marginalized group in society can become targets: people of color, women, LGBTQ+, individuals
 with disabilities, religious minorities, and so on.
- The most detrimental form of microaggressions are usually delivered by well-intentioned individuals who are unaware that they have engaged in harmful conduct toward a socially devalued group. On the surface, these everyday occurrences may on the surface appear quite harmless, trivial, or described as "small slights."
