- Joe is currently one of LCSNW Manager's and grant writers
- LCSNW currently takes Medicaid clients
- LCSNW also specializes in Immigration and other services
 - Started 25 years ago
 - Lawyers are available to assist in paperwork
 - Citizenship services are available as well as ESL tutoring. LCSNW also uses volunteers
 - Free citizenship assistance for naturalization
 - Undocumented community members are welcome
 - Free assistance on some programs
 - Staff can assist with answering questions on interviews and tests (for citizenship)
 - Can assist with getting green cards
- VPD does not enforce immigration law; If you are undocumented and need to call
 police department, they should not ask about immigration status. VPD
 encourages people to report what they see
- Crime Victim Advocacy Program
 - Can be victim of any crime or if a loved one was a victim of a crime
 - o Primary and secondary victims/witnesses can be helped
 - Does not matter where crime took place as long as they currently reside in WA
 - Free services
 - \circ $\,$ One counselor (child specialist) and one clinical Social Worker $\,$
 - o Assistance in Russian and Spanish and access to interpreters
 - Also provide assistance to Vancouver Arts School, which can help with bullying
 - Emergency financial assistance available to help with the crime (such as fixing a broken window or lock)

- Funds can help with bills related to crime
- Non-discriminatory assistance
- Intakes can be on-line, in the office, and staff can help even at the courthouse
- There is no time limit to the sessions
- LCSNW also provides clinical mental health treatment
 - Counseling
 - Case management
 - Medication management
 - $\circ \quad \text{Medicaid only at the moment} \\$
 - o Adult services only
 - Adjustment support group available (55+ for Russian population, Slavic services available in a non-threatening way to get people involved)
