#### Wraparound with Intensive Services (WISe)

- Zenia Brar and Katie Favela from Catholic Community Services provided an overview of the WISe services and current performance
- WISe provides 24/7 support including a clinical supervisor, clinician, family support/wrap coordinator, parent partner, youth peer, psychiatrist
- Services include therapy, family support, case management, peer support, medication management
- Referrals go through Katie with a screening over phone
- Multiple language are provided with a Spanish-speaking staff or interpreters and all forms are translated for families.
- Data analysis is done at the state level to help understand the effectiveness and status of roll out of WISe services across the state which is targeted to be completed in 2020.
- With a combination of BH-ASOs and BHOs across the state, there is still work on integration of data and metrics going on.
- In SW WA region, Catholic Community Services predict having 160 families.
  Currently 20 families are waiting.
- Youth peers don't provide direct crisis support but still must have variable hours (not typical M-F, 8-5 positions).

## Foundational Community Supports

- Jacob Avery with AmeriGroup provided an overview of this program which receives a Medicaid waiver from the state to provide supportive housing and supportive employment services.
- To qualify for supportive housing, you must be 18 or older. To qualify for supportive employment, you must be 16 or older.
- This is a pilot program through 2021 and is targeted for individuals with one or more of the following barriers: mental health, substance abuse, need help around the house, complex physical health needs, institutionalized, in home care givers, high risks.
- AmeriGroup is the Third party administrator (TPA) of FCS and provides administrative oversight.

- This is a statewide program with 11 sites in Clark County and is not at full capacity right now, so they are trying to get more people in the community. Referrals can come from anyone.
