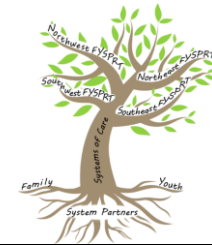

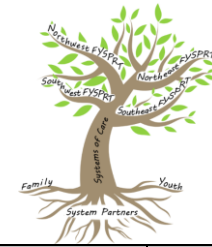

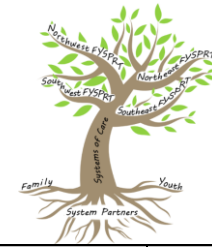

Led discussion around ideas for FYSPRT to share inspiring personal stories. Group had a consensus around including youth, family and system partners in sharing their stories. Different mediums were discussed. Story Core (NPR), Photo Voice, Instagram. It was suggested that the FYSPRT start a YouTube Channel in order to upload video. FYSPRT shared great ideas of reaching out to possible community supporters: WSU-Vancouver, Fort Vancouver High School, and Vancouver School District. FYSPRT attendees also discussed how to disseminate and share the project with the community and across the state. The local Kiggins Theatre might be a resource to share the stories of FYSPRT. This project could be used as a potential format for conducting a community needs assessment and identifying service gaps that we are not yet aware of.
