TRiO's objectives for students: Stay in school. 1. Graduate from High School 2. Engage in Advanced, College Preparation Coursework 3. Start College after High School 4. Graduate from College • They serve 1000 students. • They've got summer programming for eligible students. • They're hosted by WSU, but specifically working off of a federal grant so not focused on promotion of WSU specifically. • They stick with students and follow them through the entirety of the process of building support, getting through school, getting into college, and graduating from college.	4:25 - 4:50



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Information: CultureSeed	 CultureSeed, Behavioral Health Director, Kay Alton Provide year-round connection to nature, self and others. They believe access to the outdoors is a social determinant of health. They provide one on one and group mental health services. They support students through their school and beyond. Their population is 80 - 90% POC. They hire previously engaged students as guides, as peer support for the incoming students. They have a large number of partnerships with local organizations to work with as many people as they can.
