






# **Support for Our Members**

- Annual Costco Gold Card Membership| One card per household, per year, no age restriction. (Member must be up-to-date on annual Wellness Visit.)
- Non-Medical Transportation \$50 ORCA LIFT card (King & Pierce & Snohomish County members only), no age restriction.
- Eyeglasses| Up to \$100 for one pair every year for members 21 & older.
- Acupuncture Treatments| Seven sessions per year from a plan acupuncturist, for members 18 & older.
- Lifeline Program| Free smart phone, 4.5 GB of data, up to 300 minutes & unlimited text message if you
  qualify for members who qualify.
- Affordable Connectivity Program| Free smart phone, unlimited talk & text, 25 GB of data, 5 GB of hotspot, international calls to Canada/Mexico, additional data for members in Complex Case Management for members who qualify.







# **Support for Our Moms**

- Electric Breast Pumps| Choice of one pump from a catalog such as a wearable pump & more!
- Diabetes Meal Program| Pregnant members with diabetes can receive up to two customized meals a
  day for 10 weeks to help improve maternal health and perinatal outcomes\*
- Maternal Meal Program | Members can receive up to two customized meals a day for 14 days (28 meals per member total)\*
- Taking Care of Baby and Me® | Rewards program for going to prenatal and postpartum appointments
  on time
- Baby Essentials Bundle Eligible members receive a \$100 gift card to use toward the purchase of baby essential
  products such as: bottles and nursing supplies, formula and baby food, diapers, wipes, and creams, bath tubs,
  car seat, strollers, portable crib. One card per pregnancy.
- Circumcision for Newborns| We cover up to \$150. Must be fulfilled by an in-network provider.
  - \*Various options available including low-sodium, low-fat, diabetic-friendly, gluten-free, renal-friendly and pureed meals.







# **Support for Our Youth**

- TutorMe Online Tutorial Members ages 8-17 can get up to 24 hours of help with this online platform.
- Meditation App| Free yearly subscription to this emotional support app where youth can access guided meditations, sleep aids, and other resources to promote mindfulness and reduce stress for school aged child members.
- Boys & Girls Club Membership| Free yearly membership for members ages 6-18 where available.
- WA State 4-H Membership| Free yearly membership for members ages 5-18.
- YMCA Membership | Free yearly membership for members age 19 and under that qualify for the Y scholarship in Wenatchee & Longview, WA.
- Sports Physicals| Free yearly sports physical for members ages 7-18.







## **Fitness Support**

- Gym Membership| \$50 allowance for a gym membership for members ages 18 and older who have been diagnosed with obesity, diabetes, prediabetes and/or hypertension. Gym must be able to receive the coded card
- WW (formerly Weight Watchers®) voucher| We cover the sign-up fee, 13 weeks of classes to help you meet your weight-loss goal. One-time benefit for members 18 and older.
- Healthy Families Program | Six-month nutritional support and exercise coaching program for families
  with children ages 7-13 who are overweight, obese or have history of co-morbid conditions. Program
  includes a ten-week, family-centric program that meets twice weekly and encompasses all family
  members in making healthy lifestyle choices through a family-centric approach.
- Choose Healthy Program| Offers over 1,000 online exercise classes and fitness information to help all members get in shape, right in your own home!







## **Educational Support**

- Free GED Testing| We pay for all four GED tests or HiSet for members ages 16 and older
- Peer Support Counselor| We pay registration and annual renewal costs for members who want to become agency affiliated Peer Support Counselors. All members are eligible.
- Industry Certification Assistance| We pay for employment certification in fields such as early childhood education, foundations of reading, business education, technology education, English language arts, health and marketing for members 18+ \*
  - \*One per member, per lifetime. Member must be seeking employment or furthering education.

- Free Laptop| for members transitioning from incarceration\*\*
- Internet Essentials Package | \$100 allowance to cover cost of internet services, installation/set-up fees, and/or to purchase equipment to obtain (or strengthen) an internet connection\*\*
  - \*\*For members transitioning out of incarceration within the last 12 months and seeking employment or furthering education



## **Emotional & Behavioral Health**

- Light Box A plug-in light that helps extend the feeling of daylight during winter months for members ages 19 and older with seasonal affective disorder (SAD) or depression
- Emotional Well-Being Resource | All members 13 and older have access to this web and mobile online community designed to help members cope with emotional health issues such as depression, anxiety, stress, chronic pain, insomnia and/or managing alcohol or drug use







# **Health Kit Support**

- First aid and dental hygiene kit| Get these kits free when you fill out a personal disaster plan online
- Flu Pandemic Kit| May include essential and preventative items such as facemask, hand sanitizer & wipes
- Wound Care Kit| Includes instructions and supplies to properly care for minor wounds for members experiencing homelessness
- Life transition kit| Includes an emergency blanket, First-aid supplies, and Oral/Dental Supplies\*

\*This kit is for members who are either: experiencing homelessness <u>or</u> moving out of an institution and into the community <u>or</u> enrolled in a local employment program

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

The Southwest Washington Family Youth System Partner Round Table (FYSPRT) is a community-based group of youth, families, professionals, systems, and community members from Clark, Skamania, and Klickitat counties who are passionate about making needed changes in the System of Care (SOC) that serves those with behavioral health needs. The SW WA FYSPRT strengthens sustainable resources by providing community-based approaches to address the individual behavioral health needs of children, youth and families and ensures that family and youth are key collaborators and in positions of leadership. The SW WA FYSPRT leverages the experience and expertise of all participants dedicated to building effective behavioral health services and will report up to the Statewide FYSPRT on challenges and successes of the region.
